Course Description

The Illinois State Police Offender Registration course has been developed to educate law enforcement officers of the legal requirements for the registration, monitoring, and restrictions required for sexual offenders in the community. The course will detail the Illinois Compiled Statutes relating to procedures for law enforcement, provide an in-depth review of the SOR Act and the Murder and VOAY Act. A review of LEADS access pertaining to offender records will assist officers in identifying non-compliant status and learning the specific statute(s) which determines the duration and time frame in which an offender must register.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this class officers will be able to:

- Understand the SOR Act including the offender's duties to register and report.
- Be able to retrieve offender information including convictions and criminal histories using LEADS.
- Review residency and loitering restrictions for child sex offenders.
- Discuss the implications and habitation, livelihood, and abiding within the parameters established by statute for sex offenders.
- Understand procedures regarding registration of MVOAY.
- Learn to create and modify LEADS records of offenders.
- Identify essential searches prior to record creation (QXS, QH, QR).
- Identify information to be added to LEADS entry.
- Understand registration fees.
- Identify charges which determine duration of registration
- Examine conditions of residence for offenders on probation/parole.
- Identify removal of records (expungement, death of offender).
